POPE'S PRAYER INTENTION FOR JUNE: That priests, through the modesty and humility of their lives, commit themselves actively to a solidarity with those who are most poor.

DAY FOR LIFE: This year the Day for Life focuses on all those who are suffering or have survived domestic abuse. It provides an opportunity to pray, reflect, and to choose the ways in which action can ensure the dignity of human life is upheld at every stage of a person's life.

Following discussion about violence in the home and domestic violence at the Synod on the Family, Pope Francis wrote, 'Unacceptable customs still need to be eliminated. I think particularly of the shameful ill-treatment to which women are sometimes subjected, domestic violence and various forms of enslavement which, rather than a show of masculine power, are craven acts of cowardice. The verbal, physical, and sexual violence that women endure in some marriages contradicts the very nature of the conjugal union.' (Amoris Laetitia 54).

There will be a collection for Day for Life at the end of each Mass next Saturday and Sunday.
