The message from last Sunday's Masses

On the census form is a section where you can offer to volunteer for various things. It is to this which I want to turn my attention. The pandemic has had a huge impact in so many ways. I would like to pay tribute to all those who helped keep our churches open during some very difficult and dark days. Truly we were a beacon of light, accessible to all (who booked in!) But now we need to think seriously about bringing back rotas and so forth. Of course, the more people who are on a rota, the less often their turn will come round. And if you would wish to help in the future, but are still concerned about COVID, that can be indicated on the form.

The question is for you as parishioners: at what level do you wish the parish to operate? At a basic or enhanced level? Admittedly, the basic level still covers a lot. The Mass first and foremost, but also

confessions, visiting the sick, anointings, baptisms, weddings, funerals, blessings, and first communion preparation. But what of other things. How about flowers? They are not necessary for worship, but a lovely thing to have. But this needs volunteers. The same with refreshments after Mass: not strictly necessary, but important, so that a social time can follow the sacred time in Church. We also need people to clean the church, and help with the grounds, so that the House of God is kept in a fitting way. There are other things too. But these things are fundamentally up to you as parishioners. Do you want to keep things at a basic level, or at a higher one?

I am also keen that there be resilience, hence the desire for plenty of volunteers. This helps to free me from having to worry about so many things, so I can focus more on the core ministry. And if only a few people do things, and they wish to stand down or are unable to continue, who will take their place? Ideally, there should be a surplus of volunteers, not a deficit, so that things can thrive. We also hear a lot about how to be a more missionary parish, but I believe that we can only do this if there is a solid foundation 'in-house'. Let us not forget that we are blessed with good parish facilities at both churches, so it is good to make use of these.

So really, the ball is in your court, as to how you wish to go forward. I will help as I can, but it is up to you to take ownership of more things. I want to thank all those who do so much already, but now is the time, to borrow a phrase, to 'build back better'.

Finally, though, I must stress that the fundamental way in which you contribute to the parish is through worship, love of neighbour, and growing in holiness. If you are not able to help in some of the practical things, don't worry. Our housebound parishioners, for instance, are no less a part of the parish - because they contribute in the ways just mentioned. What is at the heart of the faith is not serving teas and coffees but serving God and neighbour. Today's appeal is not meant as any kind of a criticism of anyone, not at all. But it is a time to reflect: how I can help this parish operate, not just on a basic level, but an enhanced one.

Let us give glory to the Lord now and for ever. Amen.
